Our History

The Transforming Lives Educational Trust (TLET) was established in October 2016 and is a Charitable Trust and Company Limited by Guarantee. TLET grew out of a partnership between a high performing secondary school and primary school in Rugby, Warwickshire. The desire to work together arose from continuing population growth in the local community, our belief that we can shape and influence practice wider than our current schools, and the desire to provide the community with more high-quality school places. The Trust is set to grow over the coming years and currently comprises of two secondary-phase academies, Ashlawn School and Houlton School, and two primary-phase academies, Henry Hinde Infant School and Henry Hinde Junior School. Currently we are responsible for approximately 2500 children and young people and, along with the Trust's Central team, 350 employees and £15m of public money annually.

We are delighted to offer this exciting opportunity for an enthusiastic Examinations Officer to join our successful school.

The Examinations Officer is responsible for the coordination and organisation of both internal and external examinations. You will be responsible for managing the effective and efficient administration of examinations and must be familiar with the requirements and regulations by the awarding bodies and the Joint Council for Qualifications (JCQ) ensuring these are adhered to before, during and after the examination period.

You will communicate with the examination boards, relevant staff and when necessary, individual students with respect to: entries for all examinations, amendments, late entries and withdrawals, results, enquiries about results, post-results service, certificates, coursework and resits, for both module and final examinations. During busy exam periods you will be responsible in running examinations including practicals: preparation of exam room(s), meet/update invigilators, dealing with student special arrangements, assist with the distribution/collection of exam papers, recording absentees, exam changeovers, starting exams, prepare and pack scripts for dispatch.

You will have administrative experience including diary management and successful monitoring of procedures and processes. You will be competent in the use of ICT and experience of using data management information systems and/or online systems. There is a high need to have excellent communication skills, both oral and written, and the experience of communicating with people at all levels across an organisation. You will be an excellent team member who is highly motivated and actively seek out ways of improving your own performance and that of others in order to ensure the organisation is highly efficient, effective and sustainable. At your core is a strong moral purpose to provide the best deal for all stakeholders, but especially for the children and young people whom we serve.

- Organise and process exam entries throughout the academic year
- Liaise with Heads of Department with regards to the relevant examination boards and syllabuses studied to examination level
- Liaise with the Heads of Department and staff with regards to examination access requirements
- Liaise with examination boards as appropriate
- Provide exam timetables and invigilation timetables in advance of examination sessions, including mock exams and all public exam periods
- Undertake all administrative procedures pertaining to exams, both public and internal
- Ensure security and confidentiality of all exams as directed by exam board regulations and school policies and procedures
- Deal with routine enquiries, providing general information about the exams process including results and post-result services in person, by phone and email
- Ensure all invigilation staff are appropriately deployed and are provided with administrative support
- Be a first point of contact for students/pupils requiring help/support and referring them to other appropriate staff in school
- Handle incoming mail, ensuring appropriate distribution
- Handle outgoing mail, franking and posting, maintaining records of postage
- Maintain records/files/databases, inputting and retrieving information ensuring accuracy
- Undertake word processing, generating standard letters
- Lock all filing cabinets and ensure safe storage of keys
